Environmental Program Update





The fourth quarter was a very busy quarter for Greenstone Mine's Environment Team as they continued to conduct regulatory sampling as per the various Management Plans and permits. This includes events

such as surface water sampling, dustfall (air quality) and noise/vibration monitoring.

Noise and Vibration

Greenstone Mine began blasting within the Project area and the future Highway 11 Realignment. Intermittent blasting during construction is required to ensure a proper ground elevation is achieved for ponds, roads and pads for infrastructure. Operational mining in the open pit will consist of regularly scheduled blasts. (once per day).

Noise and vibration for the Project can be thought of in terms of its source, its path and the receiver as shown below.

How does Greenstone Mine measure noise and vibration?



General noise is measured in A-Weighted Decibels (dbA).





Blasting noise called overpressure or concussion, is measured in Linear Decibels (dB).






measured in Peak Particle Velocity (PPV).

The unit measures noise overpressure and vibration at Blasting vibration is regular intervals to monitor the general effects of mine site activities and prevent impacts to sensitive locations such as nearby residences. McLeod Park as well as waterbodies frequented by fish and other aquatic life

Based on the MECP NPC-119 guidelines for blasting, the maximum blast overpressure level allowed is 128 dB and the maximum blasting vibration level allowed is 12.5 mm/s. Greenstone Mine is continuously monitoring its blasting to ensure levels are below this limit.

Separate from blasting, noise on the Project is generated from activities such as drills, construction equipment and back up alarms on vehicles. Greenstone Mine is continuously measuring noise from the Project, and through the monitoring equipment can identify what noises may be exceeding the limits.



Exploration Update

The Exploration team completed a 15,000m definition drilling program at the Greenstone Mine site that was started earlier in the summer. The team also finalized a geotechnical drilling program that began in September.

FTE Drilling has been providing the drills and crews for both drilling campaigns.




Project Procurement

As part of the preparation for the construction decision, Greenstone Mine encourages anyone who is interested in applying for current or future jobs to take a few moments to update your resume.










Safety on our site
